DR. ANA BRIDGES**

Dr. Bridges has a doctoral degree in clinical psychology from the University of Rhode Island. She is a Professor in the Department of Psychological Science at the University of Arkansas, Director of the doctoral program in clinical psychology, and director of the Diversity Research and Enhanced Access for Minorities (DREAM) lab. Dr. Bridges has published over 130 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters, focusing on understanding and reducing mental health disparities in vulnerable, underserved populations. She has received numerous mentoring awards for her dedication to the training of underrepresented graduate students.

Dr. Ana Bridges is also a former Peace at Home Family Shelter board member. Her work lead to the first graduate level psychology interns being placed at Peace at Home Family Shelter in 2011.

This collaboration launched the counseling program at Peace at Home, which has grown and provided professional mental health services for survivors of domestic violence for the past 14 years, impacting hundreds of lives.
