On October 2nd, we welcomed 350 members of our community to the 13th Annual Courage Awards Luncheon presented by C&C Services.

This year, Peace at Home had the distinct pleasure of recognizing **Dr. Ana Bridges** as the 2025 Courage Awardee. Dr. Bridges is a Distinguished Professor in the Department of Psychological Science at the University of Arkansas, Director of the doctoral program in clinical psychology, and director of the Driving Research to Enhance Access to Mental Health (DREAM) lab.

Dr. Bridges' focus on understanding and reducing mental health disparities in vulnerable, underserved populations has made a significant impact on the lives of survivors here in Northwest Arkansas.

LETTER FROM A SURVIVOR

"I came to the Peace at Home shelter around the time COVID hit. With the common challenges of community living intensifying with the pandemic, my advocate helped connect me to counseling services.

The counseling services were a huge help to me. They also offered me adult coloring pages and colored pencils to explore as a tool for healing. My discovery of my love and talent for art began with those printed coloring pages.

Coloring sparked my curiosity into other forms of art and different art techniques. I researched other artforms through YouTube videos. Over time my love of art has grown and I've been able to create and sell my own adult coloring book as well as my artwork. I hope one day to have my own art exhibit.

While in the shelter, I was able to apply for mainstream benefits and referrals to an agency that helped me find my first legit job after many hard years of human trafficking.

Peace at Home's housing program supported me in finding my first apartment and with this newly built support system, I was able to live independently.

I enjoy the peaceful life I have built for myself. I tell everyone I know about Peace at Home. If I didn't go to Peace at Home, I don't know where I would be now."
