Whether you've been with us for years, just joined our community, or are on your own journey to safety, we want you to know: you are an important part of our work to help families feel safe again.


THE CANDY CLARK PET SANCTUARY'S FIRST YEAR!

Olivia and her two children came to Peace at Home after falling back into an abusive relationship.
